BOOKINGS:

CANCELLATIONS / AMMENDMENTS:

I understand that the walk cost includes 50% NON-REFUNDABLE deposit.
If cancellation is made more than 28 days prior to commencement of the walk I am entitled to 50% refund. If cancellation is made less than 28 days prior to commencement, there are no refund of walk fees. However, if after cancellation, my space(s) can be filled I may receive a refund, minus deposit.
Ranger Expeditions Ltd & Dog-go! will endeavour to accommodate, but cannot guarantee availability, for requested alterations to dates before 28 days of course/activity commencement.

PARTICIPATION STATEMENT - RISK WHILST ON COURSES & ACTIVITIES:

CONDITIONS:

Keeping your dog safe and happy on their adventure.

Please follow these simple instructions and tips to make sure you and your dog get the most out of your adventure with us.

- 1) Owners will be responsible for their dogs throughout their adventure, other than as described in item 2. Please keep your dog under control at all times, and on its lead unless specifically given permission by your guide to let it run off lead. If permission to be off-lead is given, your dog should still be under your control and respond to your commands.
- 2) Your guide may step in and temporarily take control of your dog if they feel that your safety and well-being, that of your dog and/or other people, farm stock or wildlife are in any way endangered.
- 3) Please ensure your dog is fit enough to complete the walks, based on us moving at a gentle pace. Inform your guide of any illnesses or injuries and of any medication carried. We will require you to sign a veterinary release form prior to starting to enable prompt local treatment should it be needed. A trained canine first aider will accompany you throughout your adventure.
- 4) While water will be provided at points during your adventure, please ensure you have enough food and water for your dog to last the duration of the walk.
- 5) Weather in the UK is notoriously changeable. In the hills it can change very quickly. If your dog is of a breed that is susceptible to the cold or rain, please bring a dog coat/jacket, suitable for your pet.
- 6) Should your dog enter water and get into difficulties, do not enter the water under any circumstances. Your guide will manage the situation to ensure both you and your pet's safety. Similarly, if your dog becomes separated from the group, do not attempt to find him/her by yourself. Again, your guide will best assess the situation and the best course of action to safely return your pet.
- 7) All the dogs are initially going to be very excited at being somewhere new with a lot of new friends. Please be aware of how your dog is behaving and allow them time and space to settle down and feel secure.
- 8) The Countryside Code gives us all a template of how we should behave in the country, and has a section for dogs and their owners. Please take a moment to read the section as printed below:-
Wherever you go, following these steps will help keep your pet safe, protect the environment, and show you are a responsible dog owner.
 - Control your dog so that it does not scare or disturb farm animals or wildlife.
 - When using the new access rights over open country and common land, you must keep your dog on a short lead between 1 March and 31 July - and all year round near farm animals - and you may not be able to take your dog at all on some areas or at some times. Please follow any official signs.
 - You do not have to put your dog on a lead on public paths, as long as it is under close control. But as a general rule, keep your dog on a lead if you cannot rely on its obedience. By law, farmers are entitled to destroy a dog that injures or worries their animals.
 - If a farm animal chases you and your dog, it is safer to let your dog off the lead - don't risk getting hurt by trying to protect it.
 - Take particular care that your dog doesn't scare sheep and lambs, or wander where it might disturb birds that nest on the ground and other wildlife - eggs and young will soon die without protection from their parents.
 - Everyone knows how unpleasant dog mess is and it can cause infections, so always clean up after your dog and get rid of the mess responsibly. Also, make sure your dog is wormed regularly to protect it, other animals and people.
